The Relocation of the families impacted by the Project has been completed

On February 27 and 28, 2020, NHPC organized the key handover ceremonies for houses built to relocate families affected by the construction of the power line between Nachtigal and Nyom 2.

The three families concerned lived in the area declared to be of public utility of the High Voltage line corridor (50 km long by 50 m wide). They had the choice between benefiting from the construction of a resettlement house by the Project or receiving the amount fixed by the Decree framing the compensation of people, victims of loss of land rights and / or destruction of property. All have opted for the construction of their new housing by the Project.

The choice of the location and the design of the future houses were carried out in collaboration with the families.

Furthermore, these new houses were built according to safety and comfort standards, significantly improved, compared to the old houses.

This certainly explains the big smiles when Mr. Joseph TSANA,

Head of Livelihood Restoration at NHPC, handed over the keys to their new homes to the lucky beneficiaries who live in Ebang and Mindjomo near Yaoundé, and in Ndji in the Batchenga subdivision,

It is important to note that NHPC also supported the new owners in their administrative formalities to enable them to acquire formal land titles, which they did not have before.

After the two families impacted by the Hydroelectric Development site who were given the keys to their houses in December 2018, it is therefore the three families impacted by the power transmission Line who are now living in much better conditions.

The relocation operation of the 5 families impacted by the Project ends with three smiles which are as much encouragement for the actors of the Nachtigal Project.
