## 5 million man-hours without a major accident

### The Nachtigal Project joins EDF's "Stop Sécurité" day.

This Tuesday, October 20, an event day devoted to safety took place everywhere within the EDF Group. Fully committed to preserving the health and safety of workers, the Nachtigal Project wished to be associated with this event.

On this occasion, NHPC was pleased to welcome on the site of the Hydroelectric Development Mrs Béatrice Buffon, EDF International Director. This visit to the Site gave her the opportunity to reiterate her attachment to safety, an absolute priority of the EDF Group for many years, and to discuss with those involved on the Worksite on the measures that have been implemented, notably :

The daily involvement in the field of the Safety of the workers and their managers since the start of works permitted the Project to cross the 5 million man-hour mark in september without a major accident.

### Safety at Nachtigal in some figures:

- 5 630 000 heures travaillées
- 2 170 workers on the site
- Cumulative Lost Time Incident Rate of 1,07
- 0 major accident
- 8 lost time accidents
- 46 accidents without stoppage or significant near-misses
- 2628 precursors managed
